

2023 Call for Submissions

Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax is a multi-disciplinary arts festival which aims to build a society that celebrates the history and struggles of working people. The annual festival serves as an extended celebration of <u>International Workers' Day</u> - known also as May Day - and seeks to feature works that speak to struggles for justice across communities and generations.

The festival's interest reaches beyond art that relates directly to labour, work or the workplace, and includes art that speaks to any fight for <u>social</u>, <u>economic or environmental justice</u>.

VISION

Advancing a culture of solidarity at the intersection of labour and art in Mi'kma'ki.

MISSION

To foster the political nature of artistic work and to promote those works that celebrate a diverse and complex working class, while drawing correlations that point toward a better future for all.

MANDATE

- Make all programming and operational decisions informed by self-critical and evolving concepts of justice
- Remain open and responsive to the communities we operate in and with
- Strive to be an accomplice in the decolonisation of the structures we operate in
- Value labour fairly in our own practices
- Be at the forefront of accessibility in the cultural sector
- Lead in the exploration of form and content for artistic presentation
- Maintain a strong local focus while having a broad reach in programming
- Provide a venue for engagement within and between the labour movement and artistic community
- Deliver an annual multidisciplinary arts festival in celebration of May Day as our flagship event
- Bring attention to other commemorations and days of action important to labour and social justice movements throughout the year

Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax's programming is not limited to any medium of artistic expression. The festival has programmed works of music, theatre, film, dance, printmaking, painting, photography, mixed-media, literature and more. Submissions for workshops, panels and lectures are also welcome. We are eager to further diversify our programming.

Mayworks began first in Toronto in 1986. There are now similar festivals in many locations across Canada, including here in Kjipuktuk/Halifax. Mayworks Halifax emerged in 2009 as a project of the Halifax-Dartmouth & District Labour Council. It has since evolved into a festival with its own administrative body supported by various Nova Scotia labour organizations and government sponsors. 2023 will mark the 14th annual Mayworks Halifax Festival. Eligibility:

Anyone is welcome to submit. We welcome submissions from any art discipline.

Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax seeks proposals that will speak of the working class experience, and of the experiences of oppressed peoples and communities. This can be extremely varied and can examine either contemporary or historical contexts. Both amateur and professional performers may apply.

<u>Submissions need not be directly focused on work, labour or unions.</u> Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax programming includes works of art that address broad themes of social and environmental justice. Any submissions that address issues of inequality and injustice, or give voice to marginalized communities, will be considered.

<u>Under-represented groups and those disadvantaged at work and in society are particularly encouraged to apply.</u> Material is particularly sought from youth, women, people with disabilities, African Nova Scotians, First Nation Communities, urban Indigenous peoples, newcomer (immigrant) populations, 2SLGBTQ+, Acadian or under-represented cultures in Nova Scotia. Proposals must be submitted in English or French for consideration.

Payment:

Artists will be compensated and Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax strives to meet union fee standards in any given discipline. However, Mayworks Halifax is <u>not a funding body for the development of new works</u> and offers remuneration for presentation only.

Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax will gladly help with grant applications and offer resources at our disposal to help see your proposal come to fruition. However, planning must be considered for the financing of project development needed prior to the presentation of a project. Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax acts as a presenter of the project, not a producer.

Guidelines:

All proposals must be received by the Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax Festival no later than <u>September 30</u>th <u>2022</u>. All events must take place during the 2022 Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax Festival within the two weeks immediately prior or four weeks after <u>May 1st, 2023</u>. Some flexibility may be possible, but contact must be made as soon as possible to inquire about available options.

You may include samples or other additional material along with the application form. These should arrive by the deadline along with the application form, but flexibility is possible if a request is made. Hand delivery is possible at the Festival office by appointment only as the office is not staffed everyday.

Follow-up and Response to your Application:

Those who have submitted proposals to the Festival will be contacted by phone in mid October or early November to ask for follow up information, finalize details and sign a contract.

NOTE: If you need confirmation from the Festival prior to an earlier funding deadline, please notify us in your submission and deliver your proposal as early as possible to allow us to review it. We will endeavor to review your submission and follow up with you in time for your deadline.

Those who submit applications that are not accepted for next year's festival will receive a letter or email to notify them of our decision.

Successful applicants will be asked to sign a contract with the Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax Festival once a financial commitment has been made from the Festival and presentation details have been confirmed.

Any promotional materials created by the artist for this festival event must mention Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax and be approved by the Festival.

- 3. When was your work created? Has it been previously presented? If so, please specify dates and locations.
- 4. Who is involved in your proposal? Are any of your artists represented by a union or arts association? Please specify which one(s).
- 5. Is your event better suited for a full evening/afternoon presentation, or better suited as part of a variety showcase? Are you intending to present/perform over multiple dates? Please specify.
- 6. Do you have a proposed venue for your event? If not, what are your venue requirements?
- 7. What are your fees for the presentation? Please specify whether the amount is total or per showing. Please indicate whether or not the fee includes HST. Keep in mind that Mayworks Kjipuktuk/Halifax is not a funding body for the development of work and will pay for presentation only.
- 8. Do you require that Mayworks Halifax provide any of the following: venue, rehearsal space, technical support, show operator, technical equipment (lighting/sound/etc.), installation, transportation, rentals, food, facilitation, other? Please specify details and costs, if known.
- 9. A) Do you have additional support or project funding for this event? Please specify.
